

BIRMINGHAM DIOCESE CARBON LITERACY TRAINING

With climate change and environmental degradation accelerating apace, it is more important than ever that those with any sort of leadership role in the Church, or a particular interest in the environment, have a clear understanding of the facts, our role as Christians in responding to them, and what we can do to tackle the problems.



The Church of England's Carbon Literacy Course has been developed in conjunction with the Carbon Literacy Foundation. In January 2023, we are running the course specifically for and tailored to Birmingham Diocese.

What will it cover?

Over three sessions, we will cover: -

- The science of climate change and the theology of creation care
- Our personal and collective carbon footprints, and what we can do; and
- Taking it wider – carbon budgets, communicating climate change, and taking action

Who would benefit from attending?

- Deanery Environment Champions
- Diocesan staff
- Clergy, or anyone with a leadership role within the Church
- Lay people with a particular interest in the environment

When and how?

Via Zoom, on **Wednesday 11th, 18th and 25th January 2023 from 2 to 4pm.**

To ensure that we have plenty of opportunity for discussion, numbers are limited to 15.

To enable participants to get the most out of the course, there is a small amount of preparation between sessions. At the end of the course, participants are invited to make pledges, and will receive a Carbon Literacy certificate, accredited by the Carbon Literacy Foundation.
